



Phonics - ng as in king

Please note - it is **strongly recommended** students get on to Seesaw to see the teacher-led phonics lesson.

This week we are learning the "ng" sound. Check the picture below for your tongue placement. You should feel this sound in the back of your throat as air comes out of your nose.



Can you hear "ng" at the end of the word king? Say "th" | OUC |

Now say it quietly.

The two letters that work as a team to make the sound "ng" are the letter \mathbf{n} and the letter \mathbf{g} .

It is <u>NOT</u> two separate sounds, we do not say "n" and "g". Remember, when two letters make one sound, it is called a **digraph**.

In the English language, the "ng" digraph does not appear at the start of words, only in the middle or at the end.

Your job for today: circle the focus digraph "ng" in each word. ONLY colour the pictures that have the "ng" digraph in its name. Remember - "th" can be in the middle or at the end of the word!
