#### A - Unjustified Absence





# Why is it important to know about the weather?

The weather is what happens outside every day. It can be sunny, windy, rainy, hot, or cold. Knowing about the weather is important for the farmers who grow our food. It also helps people to plan what to wear and what to do every day.


Watch Episode 1: Details, details...
